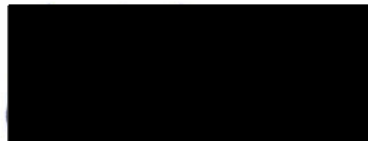

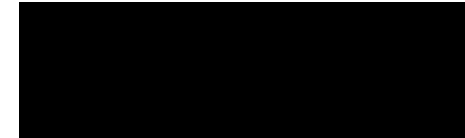

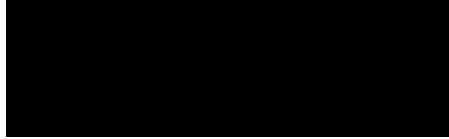

Accordingly, it is by the court on this 8th day of May, 2025,

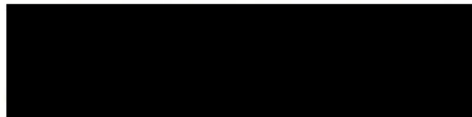
ORDERED:

**TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF THE UNITED STATES
AIR FORCE COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS:**

Pursuant to Rule 23.3(m)(3) and (4) of this Court’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, Appellant hereby moves for an enlargement of time (EOT) to file Assignments of Error (AOE). Appellant requests an enlargement for a period of 30 days, which will end on **18 August 2025**. The record of trial was docketed with this Court on 21 March 2025. From the date of docketing to the present date, 110 days have elapsed. On the date requested, 150 days will have elapsed.

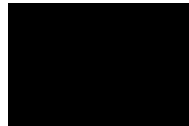
On 10 September 2024, at Aviano Air Base, Italy, a military judge sitting as a special court-martial found Appellant guilty, consistent with his pleas, of one charge and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle resulting in personal injury, a violation of Article 113, Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ). R. at 1, 17, 20, 24, 72-73. The military judge sentenced Appellant to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,340 of his pay per month for three months, to be confined for 100 days, and to be discharged with a bad-conduct discharge. R. at 150. The convening authority took no action on the findings or the sentence, and declined Appellant’s requests for deferment. Convening Authority Decision on Action (Oct. 17, 2024).

The trial transcript is 150 pages long. The electronic record of trial contains eight Prosecution Exhibits, thirteen Defense Exhibits, eight Appellate Exhibits, and one Court Exhibit. Appellant is not currently confined.

Undersigned counsel has just been detailed to this case and has scheduled Individual Training Days to review Appellant's case within the enlarged period and will consult with the Appellant and advise him regarding his rights and this Court's order.

WHEREFORE, Appellant requests that this Court grant the requested enlargement of time for good cause shown.

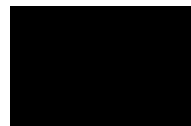

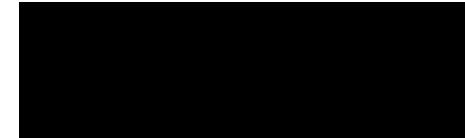

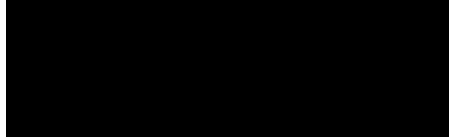
