


On 10 November 2022 at Robins Air Force (AFB), Georgia, Appellant was tried and convicted by a military judge sitting as a General Court-Martial. R. at 1-17. Consistent with his pleas, the military judge found him guilty of one charge and specification in violation of Article 128, Uniform Code of Military Justice (UMCJ). R. at 45. The military judge sentenced Appellant to 30 days' confinement and to be dismissed from the Air Force. R. at 133. The convening authority took no action on the findings or sentence, noting Appellant did not request any deferment of confinement or waiver of automatic forfeitures. R. at Vol. 1, Convening Authority Decision on Action – *United States v. First Lieutenant Samuel J. Trueman*, undated.

The record of trial consists of three prosecution exhibits, two appellate exhibits, and one court exhibit; the record is 134 pages. Appellant is not currently confined.

Through no fault of Appellant's, Maj Fleszar has been working on other assigned matters and has not yet started review of Appellant's case. Maj Fleszar will be commencing terminal leave on 1 June 2023 and will be unable to complete review of the case prior to terminal leave. Maj Bosner has just been assigned as new counsel for Appellant, and has similarly not yet started review of Appellant's case. Accordingly, an enlargement of time is necessary to allow Maj Bosner to review Appellant's case and advise Appellant regarding potential errors.

Counsel is currently assigned 38 cases; 18 cases are pending initial AOEs before this Court.



- 5. *United States v. Daughma*, ACM 40385: The record of trial consists of 18 Prosecution Exhibits, five Defense Exhibits, 64 Appellate Exhibits, and one Court Exhibit. The transcript is 841 pages. Counsel is reviewing the record.


